### WHO WE ARE?

Utah is home to eight sovereign tribal nations: Confederated Tribes of Goshute, Navajo Nation, Northwestern Band of Shoshone Nation, Paiute Indian Tribe of Utah, San Juan Southern Paiute, Skull Valley Band of Goshute, White Mesa Community of the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe, and Ute Indian Tribe. All 8 state and federally recognized tribes are currently represented in our program in addition to several students from tribes that exist outside of the state of Utah such as the Choctaw and Lakota Nations. We are very proud to have such a diverse program and would like to continue to expand support for all tribes. We want to continue to expand our program and seek to be as inclusive as possible.
