PARENT COMMITTEE MEETING

Parents, we need your help, and here is why... first, some history...The Indian Education Act of 1972 authorized federal funding for educational programs that serve Native American students in public schools. The Act authorized federal funding for a variety of programs that serve Native American students, including bilingual education programs, compensatory education programs, and programs to improve the quality of education in schools with high concentrations of Native American students. The Act also established the National Advisory Committee on Indian Education to advise the Secretary of the Interior on matters related to Indian education.

The Act requires local educational agencies to develop and implement Indian education plans that address the unique needs of Native American students. These plans must be developed in consultation with Indian tribes and parents. The Act emphasizes the importance of culturally relevant education for Native American students. This means that educational programs should be designed to incorporate Native American history, culture, and languages.

To maintain compliance with this funding or if you have ideas on how we can better serve our students, we need you on our Native Planning Committee. We will be holding a meeting on **November 7th at 6:15 pm**. Complementary pizza will be provided.
